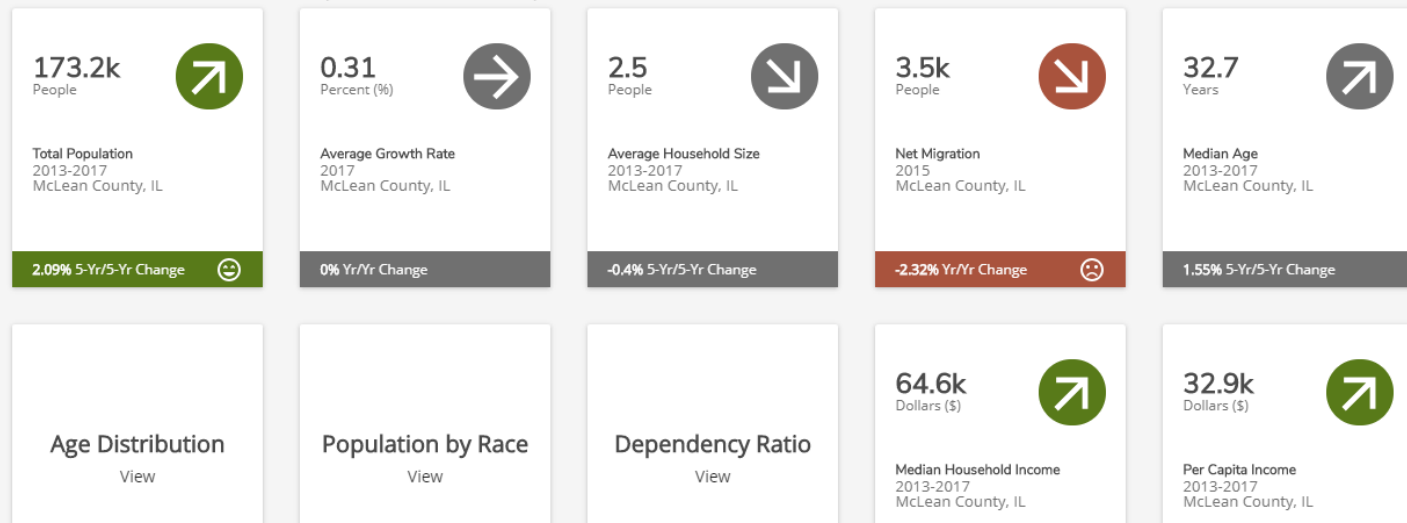

- A community's housing stock should align with the economic status of people seeking housing
- Dimensions include
 1. Income- “Income Qualified” or “Market Rate Affordable”
 2. Provider- Public Sector, Non-Profit Sector, Private Sector
 3. Housing Age- New vs. Existing
 4. Typology- Multi-Family Housing, Single-Family Housing, Specialized Housing
 5. Funding- Federal and State, Local, Private

- **3,667 units are Income Qualified units out of 71,582 total units in the County (5.12%)**

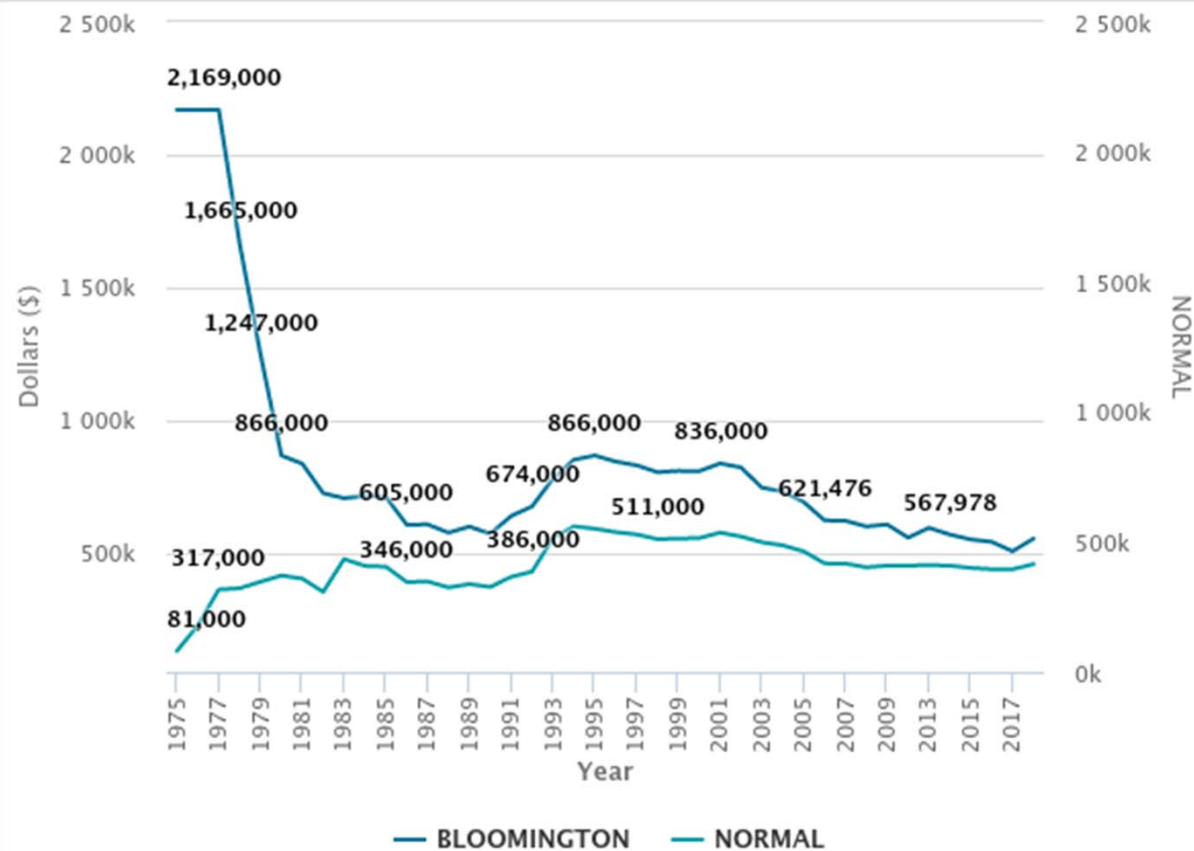
